What is a Zine Zine?

Traditionally, Zines Are:

- **★** Noncommercial
- **★** Nonprofessional
- ★ Small circulation
- ★ Self-published
- ★ Not created for profit
- ★ Associated with counter cultures and marginalized peoples

- ★ Use both text and image either original or found/appropriated







Feminist Remix


- ★ Women and Gender Studies class
